

Conditions of Entry

Participants at the HMC Mates & Skates event agree to the conditions of entry and all health and safety requirements. Participants may be refused entry to HMC facility or asked to leave.

The aim of the conditions of entry is to keep the HMC Centre as a fun, safe and non-threatening place for everyone.

Participants must follow all signs around the Centre and follow requests and instruction given by HMC management and staff.

Entry is by gold coin donation. The donation enables you to receive a Mates & Skates wrist band which serves as a pass-out.

Participants roller skating are responsible to bring their own protective gear.

An area of HMC carpark will be mark-off for beginner skaters.

Children under the age of 16 must be supervised by a parent or a responsible guardian aged 18 or over.

Participants must behave in a safe and respectful manner so everyone has a fun and safe experience at the Centre.

Participants roller-skate at their own risk. HMC does not accept liability for any injury or death to any individual while at the centre.

The use of alcohol, smoking and drugs is not permitted at HMC centre.

Animals are not permitted to be brought into the Centre except for Guide Dogs.

Behaviour considered offensive, inappropriate that affects the fun of other participants at the Centre is not accepted. A participant, or group may be ask to leave.

To respect the privacy of participants any photography, video or audio recording requires a signed permission to publish by HMC Centre.

Suitable clothing and footwear is required.

Participants with serious illness, COVID-19 tested positive are asked to stay at home. Emergency kits are on-site and staff available are First Aid trained. Participants agree to receive any medical treatment that HMC staff may consider necessary if they incur an injury at the Centre.

HMC accept no liability for theft, loss or damage to personal property.

HMC management has the right to refuse entry and to remove an individual or group from the Centre at its discretion. This includes persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol, acting dangerously or in an unsafe way; is disruptive or antisocial.

To the full extent permitted by law, participants release the Centre and the HMC from all claims and liability in respect of, and indemnity the Centre fully against claims or liability to any other person and expense the Centre incurs or may incur in respect of any personal injury, death, theft, loss or damage arising from the participant's entry into and use of the Centre and its facilities or the entry or use by minors in their care or control.
